By consent of all the parties herein the Master Commissioner is directed to collect the bonds herein before they fall due and in collecting them to credit said bonds by the amount due to John S. Buster, Nim Buster, Everett Buster and John and Nim Buster, the latter being entitled to a part of the interest of the Defendant Emma RoBards as herein set out; but from the interest of John and Nim Buster he will retain in his hands the sum of Forty three hundred and six and 64/100 dollars, (\$4306.64), to pay two lien notes executed to Emma RoBard of two thousand and twenty dollars each, with interest on each of said notes from January 1, 1912, and which notes are now held and owned by the State Bank and Trust Company and the Christian Church Widows and Orphans Home of Kentucky, of Louisville, Ky., as set out in the former judgment herein, each of said defendants being the owner of one note.

The two purchase money bonds, with interest from December 2, 1912, to February 6, 1913, amount to \$70,681.98

Of this amount each of the five children are entitled to one-fifth except Emma RoBards who is entitled to a fifth interest in the residue of the widows life estate after deducting her absolute interest therein as follows:
