The plaintiff J. B. Scanlan says that the defendant M. B. Singer is indebted to him in the sum of \$32.30, for goods and merchandise which he furnished to the defendant at his special instance and request and for which the defendant promised and agreed to pay; he says that his claim, is just, due and wholly unpaid and that he ought to recover from the Defendant M.B.Singer the said sum of \$32.30, with interest and his costs herein and he files an itemnized statement showing said goods and merchandise purchased and the dates of said purchases and makes the same a part hereof.

He says that the defendant M.B.Singer has no property or not enough thereof in this State subject to execution to satisfy plaintiffs demand and that the collection of same will be endangered by a delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendant M.B.Singer for the sum of \$32.30, with interests and costs herein, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant that the Walnut Hill Floral Company be summoned as Garnishee herein and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
