The Plaintiff, Everette R. Peacock Co., states that it is a corporation organized under the laws of Illinois and authorized by its articles of incorporation to transact business in all states of the Union, and to sue and be sued in its corporate name.

Plaintiff states that the Defendant, F. C. Chelf, is indebted to it in the sum of One Hundred and Forty-one Dollars and 30 cents (\$141.30) for goods and merchandise sold and delivered by Plaintiff to Defendant at his special instance request, in March, 1920, Defendant agreeing at the time to pay therefor the sum charged in the account filed herewith, as part hereof, marked "Account".

No part of said account has been paid. Plaintiff says that ^{its} account was due on delivery of the goods, viz., April 1, 1920. Wherefore Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of \$141.30 and interest thereon from April 1, 1920, his cost herein expended, and for all proper relief.
