GAY PARASOLS SEEN IN PARIS



PARIS—Gay parasols, in varied hues and displaying a hundred and one types of amusing and colorful plastic handles, are now at the height of their season along the boulevards. The parasol pictured at the top is blue rayon tafeta and has a handle in the shape of a chestnut burr in dark red plastic with a strap woven from many-colored raffia. Below, an umbrella in natural color straw and a fabric of slit cellulose film shows a handle of black plastic material in the shape of an iris. Next, the parasol is of plain surah with a handle of amber colored plastic in twisted effect and a big black ring of the same material. At the bottom, the Chinese model is made entirely of slit cellulose film, the handle being designed in a transparent acetate plastic with a hand-painted heart at the top.

Hints for Homemakers



If you are building a bookcase or kitchen cabinet, or want more shelves in an old one, an adjustable shelf arrangement can be made by nailing a piece of corrugated tin roofing on each side of the bookcase or cabinet, with the corrugations running horizontally. If the span of the shelves is not more than 18 to 24 inches, shelves of heavy tempered pressed wood can be cut to size and placed at any desired level.

Know Your Language

THE combination "equally as" frequently crops up in present-day writing and conversation. It is never good English. Do not say, "Their suggestion seems equally as good as yours." Say, "Their suggestion seems as good as yours," or "Their suggestion and yours seem equally good."

Our word "supercilious," meaning haughtily contemptuous or disdainful, comes down to us from "superciliosus," a Latin word meaning, literally, "eyebrowish." The Romans recognized that raising the eyebrows was a characteristic habit of the haughty, arrogant man; so they combined their words "super" (over) and "cilium" (eyebrow) to form "supercilium," meaning "pride," and "superciliosus," meaning "haughty" or "arrogant."
