The Plaintiff, James *Kartesis* states that he is the owner of a certain restaurant located in Harrodsburg Kentucky and known by and named the Farmers Restaurant and which is at the present time managed for the said plaintiff by one M. D. Stathis. The plaintiff further states that he is the owner and entitled to the possession of the following personal property which was attached in the hands of M. D. Stathis on March 9, 1917 and which was in the said restaurant known as the Farmers Restaurant; at the time of the said attachment:

five tables, eleven stools & chairs, 1 coffee cooler, 2 ice boxes, 1 range, 1 coal oil cooking stove, 4 cans chicken soup, 14 cans tomato soup, 47 small boxes raisins, 20 boxes mince meat, 20 boxes soap, 10 quart cans coffee, 2 hams, 2 dozen small bowls, 2 dozen small dishes, 4 dozen large dishes, 7 boxes cigars, 5 boxes cigarettes mixed brand.

The plaintiff states that none of the property mentioned above was ever the property of M. D. Stathis or any one else save the plaintiff; that the time the property was levied on it belonged exclusively to the plaintiff and not to M. D. Stathis and that he M. D. Stathis protested against the attachment and notified the attaching creditors through their attorney, C. E. Rankin that said property and said restaurant belonged solely to the said plaintiff.

WHEREFORE plaintiff asks that he be made a party to the original action; that this attachment as to his property mentioned above be dismissed for his costs and for all other proper relief to
