JUDGMENT.

It being made to appear to the satisfaction of the Court by proof heard that Mary Thompson has been duly appointed as ^{administratrix} ~~executrix~~ of the estate of Charles P. Thompson, deceased, and has duly qualified in this court as such personal representative; and, further, that among the personal assets of said estate were and are two Fourth Liberty Bonds for the sums of \$100.00 and \$50.00, respectively, bearing serial numbers 801601 and 392503, respectively; and it further appearing that other personal assets of said estate have been exhausted, and, in order to pay the taxes on the real estate left by said decedent, it has become necessary ^{to sell} ~~the~~ the two Liberty Bonds herein-above mentioned:

It is therefore adjudged by the Court that it is necessary to sell said bonds for the purpose of paying the taxes on the real estate and said administratrix is hereby authorized and directed to offer the two aforesaid bonds for sale upon the open market ~~and make arrangements~~ and sell the same for the purpose hereinbefore indicated, and the Clerk of the Court will certify this order to the proper parties.
