The undersigned, Isaac S. Hendren, W. B. Hatchett and E. B. VanArsdall would report that after having been sworn they met on the premises on March 11, 1922 as directed, then adjourned to March 21, 1922, when they proceeded to make a survey of the entire landed estate of Charles P. Thompson, finding that the whole contained 140 acres.

We then allotted to the widow Mary R. Thompson as dower, the following tract with improvements thereon beginning at ¹ a stone in the center of the Jackson turnpike corner to lot No. 2, thence with line of lot No. 2 S $40\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W 16 chains to ² a stone ~~in line of lot No. 1~~ and corner to lot No. 2, thence first with line of No. ² 1 and then with line of No. 3 then with line of lot No. 4 S $49\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E 19.36 chains to ³ corner to McCrosky heirs in line of lot No. 4, thence with their line N ~~49~~ $40\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 16 chains to the center of the turnpike, ⁴ corner to McCrosky heirs, thence with the center of the turnpike N $49\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W 19.36 chains to ¹ the beginning containing 31 acres, subject to a passway fourteen feet in width along the East line of same out to the Jackson turnpike said passway being 14 feet wide and ~~running~~ beginning at the point in line of lot No. 4 and running N $40\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 16 chains to the turnpike.

We allotted lot No. 1 to Virginia T. King Beginning at ¹⁰ a stone in the center of the Jackson turnpike corner to lot No. 2 thence with the center of the turnpike S 64° W 10.40 chains to ²⁰ corner to Balden, thence
