They say that at the special instance and request

of the defendant H. R. Hawkins they sold and delivered to him mer

chandise to the amount of \$98.52, an ~~xxxxxxx~~ itemized account of

which is filed herewith. No part of which has ever been paid. That

he agreed and promised to pay the said sum and that the charges

are reasonable.

Wherefore they pray judgment against the defendant for

the said sum of \$98.52 with interest from July 1st 1922 and for

their cost and for all proper relief.

Johnson states that he is a member of the firm of Johnson and Son: that their claim is just and that they ought to recover against the defendant the said sum of \$98.52 with interest thereon from July 1st 1922 and the cost of this action.
