Plaintiff says the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$67.45 for work and labor rendered and done for him under contract and agreement to pay therefor, and that the defendant has agreed and promised to pay him said sum but though it is past due has failed to do so.

He states that said claim is just, due and owing; that he believes he should recover of the defendant the sum of \$67.45 with interest and costs; that the defendant is about to sell, convey and otherwise dispose of his property or a material portion thereof, with intent to cheat, hinder and delay his creditors including this plaintiff.

He states that the defendant has not sufficient property in this state subject to execution to satisfy this indebtedness, interest and costs and the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment for \$67.45 with interest from Jan 1, 1915, for an order of attachment and garnishment and his costs and all proper relief.
