Dean is indebted to him for seed wheat which the plaintiff furnished to the defendant, at his special instance and request and for which he agreed to pay, in the sum of Seventy Five Dollars; he says that said amount is just, due and unpaid and that he believes that he should recover said amount from the defendant with interest and costs of this action. He says that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiff's demand and the demand of defendant's creditors.
