Plaintiff Fort Harrod Motor Company says that it is a partnership composed of ~~WALTER~~ Walter Martin and G.L. Johnson, doing a general Automobile Business in the City of Harrodsburg, Ky; it says that the defendant John McDaniel is indebted to it in the sum of a balance of \$12,00, for tires furnished to the defendant and for which he promised and agreed to pay; it says that said account is just, due and unpaid and that no part of same has been paid.

Phillips be summoned as a garnishee herein, for its costs and for whatever relief it may appear entitled to.
