



Plaintiff, Byck Bros. & Co., states that the Defendant, Sadie Buster, by her promissory note, dated Mch. 8, 1921, which she executed and delivered to Plaintiff, promised and agreed to pay Plaintiff THIRTY DAYS after said date the sum of FIFTY THREE DOLLARS AND SIXTY TWO CENTS (\$53.62) with interest thereon from date at the rate of 6 per centum per annum until paid, no part of which has been paid. Plaintiff files said note herewith as part hereof, marked "A" for identity.

Plaintiff says that in the execution of said note the Defendant signed her name Mrs. E. E. Buster, but that Mrs. E. E. Buster and Sadie Buster are one and the same person, and that the Defendant is the person who executed and delivered the note sued on to Plaintiff. Wherefore Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of \$53.62 and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from Mch. 8, 1921, until paid, and its cost herein expended. It prays for all proper relief.
