This cause coming on for hearing and it appearing that the defendants have been duly summoned and failing to answer the court being advised adjudges that the Plaintiff recover of the defendants the sum of \$163.05 with 6% interest from May 2, 1919 and its costs herein expended for which execution may issue

And it is adjudged that to secure the payment of said sum of principal interest and costs that plaintiff has a valid lien on one Maxwell five passenger automobile being the same sold to defendants by Alford's Garage ~~xxxxxx~~ spring of 1919; it is adjudged that the automobile be sold by the Sheriff of Mercer County at public auction on Saturday Jan 31, 1920 in front of the Court House Door in Harrodsburg, Ky to raise the money to pay said judgment interest and costs; it will be sold on a credit of three months with interest from date of sale; for the purchase money the sheriff will take bond with good surety; before making the sale the sheriff will advertise it by posting a notice containing the time, place, terms of sale and description of the property, one at the court house door and one at three other public places in the vicinity of the property for ten days next preceding the date of sale, and also by inserting a like notice in some newspaper published in Harrodsburg, Ky for three consecutive issues thereof next preceding the date of sale. The sheriff will report his acts to the court.
