RE: NOTICE TO BUILD LINE FENCE

Dear Mrs. Mamie Prewitt

Now that the division has been made in the fence dividing my land and yours along the cliff beginning at the Southern Railway where you and I corner and running with our dividing line to the county dirt road giving each of us a one-half thereof 1332 feet. Mr. King said that you agreed for he and myself to divide the same which we did and he as your agent was satisfied that the division was equal and equitable. The fence now standing on this line was built by my predecessor in title and was conveyed to me with my land, hence I will only have to build 195 feet new fence and repair and repair the old, which I have done, now, I have repeatedly talked to your husband in regard to this fence, but it seems that for some reason it never has been convenient for him or you to build the fence. My stock are in danger at all times from wandering upon the cliff and being crippled or permitted to stray away, it is not for any reason but purely business that I now give you this notice, but you may take notice from this writing that unless you do build this fence within 90 days from the date hereof I shall erect the same and collect the cost thereof from you under the statutes of Kentucky.
