Mulford Miller, this the 1st day of November, 1926.

Plaintiff, Mulford Miller states that defendant, Charles Walker is indebted to him in the amount of \$10.70 for merchandise, sold and delivered to defendant at his special instance and request, and for which he then and there promised to pay said amount. Plaintiff says that said account is past due and though demand has been made upon defendant, he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said amount or any part of same.

Plaintiff says that this is an action upon a contract, being a contract to pay money for merchandise sold and delivered to defendant; that said account is just; that he believes he ought to recover the full amount of the account to wit, \$10.70; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness, and collection of demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against defendant for the sum of \$10.70, for cost of this action and for all other relief to which he may appear entitled.
