

pregnancy and immediately after the pigs were farrowed.

Never give pregnant brood sows a "force feed treatment."

Never mix salt with the Remedy when it is being fed to hogs other than pregnant brood sows.

FORCE FEED TREATMENT FOR WORMY HOGS.

If your hogs are wormy, handle them as follows: Separate those weighing 100 lbs. and over, from those weighing less than 100 lbs., and keep all feed away from both herds for 24 hours. At the expiration of this time, give to each ten head of those weighing 100 lbs. and over, $2\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. of MoorMan's Hog Remedy, thoroughly mixed with 2 gallons of dampened feed, preferably oats. Repeat this dose every 12 hours for from three to five times, or until results are obtained. If you are treating pigs weighing from 25 to 40 lbs. each, mix only 1 lb. of MoorMan's Hog Remedy with 2 gallons of feed for each ten head.

After giving a force feed treatment put MoorMan's Hog Remedy in the Self-Feeder and place it where your hogs can have access to it and see that they eat enough of the Remedy to keep their bowels open and moving freely. This **must** be done or they will again become

infested with worms in two or three weeks' time.

It must be remembered that hogs occasionally become so badly run down as the result of worms in them, that they will not eat feed with any kind of worm expelling preparation mixed in it. In this case every hog that does not eat should be drenched as follows: Mix one quart of MoorMan's Hog Remedy with one gallon of warm water and give one quart of this mixture to each hog.

READ CAREFULLY.

The weight of one gallon of MoorMan's Hog Remedy is 6 lbs.; one-half gallon weighs 3 lbs.; one quart $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. and one pint $\frac{1}{2}$ of a lb.

Always be sure that each hog gets his proportionate part of MoorMan's Hog Remedy when a force feed treatment is given.

Always provide plenty of trough space when a force feed is given. Always separate the large hogs from the small, weaker ones when a force feed is given.

When possible use soaked oats in giving a force feed of MoorMan's Hog Remedy. If oats cannot be had, give in slop, swill or dampened ground feed. Never use sweet milk.
