

When feeding MoorMan's Hog Remedy in the self-feeder, remove all salt, ashes, coal, charcoal or tankage. Never try to feed any of these mixtures at the same time the remedy is being fed in the feeder. It is unnecessary for salt to be fed at the same time MoorMan's Hog Remedy is being fed, although there isn't an ounce of salt in a ton of the Remedy. Sulphate of Soda, which it contains, usually satisfies the hog's desire for salt.

When hogs have been given a force feed treatment, be very careful in putting them back on feed. They should be either put in a pasture to begin with and not given any food other than grass, or they should have a small amount of ground feed and not too much of any kind of feed, especially corn. Corn should not be fed for a week or ten days.

Do not be afraid to take your hogs off feed for two or three days unless they are in the fattening pen and about ready for market. This in itself will do them some good. It gives their system a rest and it is positively necessary in order to get the best results when giving a force feed treatment.

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
