The Plaintiffs W W Ensminger and C B Sullivan, Jr, state that they are partners doing business under the firm name of Ensminger & Sullivan: that on the 10th day of Sept 1920, the deft Ida B McCampbell by her promissory note which she executed and delivered to the W W Ensminger & Eastland Company, a corporation, signed and produced. Their note recites in part as follows: W W Ensminger & Eastland Company the sum of \$123.00 with interest thereon from date: that the said note was by the said W W Ensminger & Eastland Company, on its dissolution Dec 31st 1920, duly assigned and transferred to these plaintiffs. It says that no part of said note has ever been paid except the sum of \$15.00 paid on the 20th day of June 1921.

They say that the said Ida B McCampbell is about to sell, convey or otherwise dispose of her property with the fraudulent intent to cheat, hinder and delay her creditors: that she has not sufficient property in this State to pay the plaintiffs' demand and the demand of defendant's creditors and that the collection of their demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found: that their claim is just and that they ought to recover thereon the sum of \$123. with interest from Sept 10th 1920 subject to the credit aforesaid, and their cost of this action. Said note is filed herewith.

Wherefore they pray judgment against the defendant for \$123.
