HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS AWARDED TONIGHT

Commencement exercises tonight will close the brilliant series of events marking the 1936 finals of the Harrodsburg high school, when the 53 seniors will receive their diplomas.

Dr. Raymond Kent, president of the University of Louisville, is to make the commencement address on the subject: "The Future From the Mirror of the Past." Dr. Kent's ability as a speaker and educator goes far beyond his own state. What he has to say is always worthwhile and his coming to Harrodsburg is an honor to the school and the city. Superintendent W. W. Ensminger is to be congratulated for securing the outstanding speakers he has brought here for the school programs. Not many high schools can boast of men of such prominence and mental gifts.


After the processional, tonight's program will open with the invocation by Rev. G. R. Tomlin, pastor of the Harrodsburg Baptist church, and close with the benediction given by Rev. T. Hassell Bowen, of the Christian church. Several soloists will add to the musical features. Mrs. Charles N. Riker will render "The Song of the Soul;" Mrs. Erroll Draffen is to give "Carmena Waltz," and Mrs. Gore Moberley "Kashmire Song." All are gifted singers and their voices are beautiful additions to any program. Mrs. J. Hal Grimes will play the marches and accompaniments.

Principal J. H. Parker, of the high school, will award the diplomas and the honors. He has had this distinction for seven years, and now turns it over to his successor as he has been elected superintendent of the school at Lebanon, and passes from Harrodsburg to an advanced position in his profession as a teacher.

1936 Board and Teachers


