vs. Answer of State Bank & Trust Company, Garnishee.

Sam Turner, Dft.

The State Bank & Trust Company, as Garnishee, for answer herein, says that at the time of service of process on it, and now, it held, and is now holding, warehouse receipts issued by the Burley Tobacco Growers Co-Operative Association to Dft. Sam Turner, Numbers 51203 for 1850 pounds and 119781 for 3945 pounds of tobacco, as security for loans made to the Defendant Terhune for the sums of \$175.00 and \$309.06 respectively, with interest at 6 per cent from the 1 day of Jan, 1923 until paid; that the advance payment by the Tobacco Company as first installment on first delivery was \$222.28, and on the second, ~~722~~\$351.23., the difference in loans and advancements being paid to Defendant. It states that its debts with interest is to be paid out of the next installments due from Tobacco Company, and whatever remains after payment of same, will be held by it subject to the orders of court, said warehouse receipts having been assigned to it with power to collect when due. Having answered, it prays for all proper relief in the premises.

These payments are supposed to represent about one third of sale price, leaving 2/3 thereof, or thereabouts, yet to be paid.
