
JOHN ISON,

The plaintiff John Ison for Answer to plaintiffs petition herein denies that a few weeks ago that he by carelessly and negligently operating his truck upon a public thoroughfare in Mercer County, Kentucky, near Burgin, and by carelessly and negligently loading said truck so as to have a large part of said load projecting over the sides of same so as to interfere with the traveling public and by occupying the entire road and refusing and failing to give this plaintiff one-half of said road or any part thereof, ran into, against and over this plaintiff and damaged his car in the sum of \$75,00 or in any other sum. Wherefore &c.

Par....2. The defendant referring to and making first paragraph a part hereof as fully as if copied herein for further Answer states that he is not the owner of the truck which plaintiff alleges ran into and damaged his car and was not the owner of same at the time of the alleged accident and that at the time of the alleged damage to plaintiffs car as set out in his petition that this defendant was not present driving or operating said truck and that at said time the said truck was not being used for any purpose for this defendant or on business for this defendant; Defendant further answering says that at the time of the alleged accident to plaintiffs car the said truck was being used by and under the control of the L. E. Myers Company in work being done by said Company in the building and construction of the Dix River Dam.

Wherefore defendant prays that plaintiffs petition herein be dismissed, for his costs and whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
