The plaintiff Clell Coleman & Sons state that they are a firm composed of Clell Coleman, Walter Coleman and Lee James Coleman, doing a general Milling, Coal and Lumber Business at Burgin, Mercer County, Kentucky, and that the defendant Speed Royalty is indebted to said firm in the sum of \$38,99 for coal which the plaintiff furnished and delivered to the defendant at his special instance and request and for which he promised and agreed to pay and that demand for payment of same has been made; plaintiffs say that said account is just, due and unpaid and that no part of same has been paid and that they ought to recover from the defendant the above named amount with interest and costs; they say that the defendant has no property in this State or not enough thereof subject to Execution to satisfy the demand of plaintiffs and demands of defendants creditors and that the collection of thier claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found; they ask that the Burley Tobacco <sup>Cyprus</sup> Cooperative Association be summoned as garnishee herein.

Wherefor plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant Speed Royalty for the said sum of \$38,99 with interest and costs of this action; for a general order of attachment against the property of defendant and for whatever relief they may appear entitled to.
