The Plff, Myrtle Clark states that the Defendants Meyer Lantz and Clifford Boyd, are partners doing business under the name of Lantz & Boyd, and as such are engaged in the operation of a Vaudeville show known as the Oriental Girl Show, which is being conducted at this time on the grounds of the Mercer County Fair Association in Harrodsburg.

She states that on or about the 15th of July 1914, she was employed by Defendants to perform a certain character dance in said show known as the Oriental Dance, at ~~the sum of~~ ^{the sum} Thirty dollars per week, which Defendants agreed to pay at the end of each week's service. Plaintiff says that in pursuance of said agreement, she entered the employment of Defendants on July 20th, at Mount Sterling, Kentucky, and executed daily the services required of her as embodied in the contract, for the week ending July 25th, at which time she demanded the amount due her therefor, but up to this time Defendants have paid her only \$9.00, leaving a balance of \$21 due her. She therefore states that her claim against the Defendants is for a balance of \$21. due for services rendered Defendants at their special instance and request; that said claim is just and correct and she believes she ought to recover of the Defendants the sum of \$21. and her costs herein expended. She further states that the Defendants, and each of them, are non-residents of the State of Kentucky, though temporarily in Mercer County at this time in charge of the show above mentioned.
