

THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY,

To any Sheriff, Constable, Coroner, Jailer, Marshal or Policeman of the State of Kentucky:

It appearing from information given on oath by County Attorney

that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

Custus Taylor

has committed the offense of cutting with a knife J.D.Yates, whereby he
die not die thereby

in the county of Anderson and State of Kentucky, in the manner and
form following: Heretofore, to-wit, On the 12 day of October 1932 in the
county and State aforesaid, the said Custus Taylor

did then and there wilfully abd maliciously
cut, strike or stab J.D.Yates with a knife, sword or other deadly
weapon with intention to kill, if the person so stabbed, cut or
bruised die not thereby

contrary to the form of the statute in such cases made and provided and against the peace and
dignity of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. You are therefore commanded forthwith to arrest
the said Custis Taylor

and bring him before County Judge
of Anderson County, to be dealt with according to law.
