The plaintiff, R.S.Vanarsdall says that he is a member of the firm of R.S.Vanarsdall and Brother, composed of hims elf and Joe Vanarsdal, The plaintiff R.SVanarsdall and Brother says that the defendant Ad Lewis is indebted to him in thesum of \$113.18 a balanc with intrest on same ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ for merchandize furnished and delivered to the said Ad Lewis at his special instance and request and for which he promised and agreed to pay; Plaintiff ~~xxxxxx~~ says that said account is just, due and unpaid and that plainitff is ~~untitled~~ to recover said ammount with intrest from this date until paid and their costs herein expended.

Plaintiff sayd that the defendant has no property in this state or not enough thereof subject to execution to satisfy the claim of plaintiff and the demands of defendant's creditors and that the collection of their claim will be endangered by delay in obtain judgement or return of no property found; plaintiff files herewith as a part hereof an itimized statement of the above named merchand furnished, marked as exhibit "A".

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgement against the defendant Ad Lewis for the sum of \$113.18 with six percent intrest theron from the second day of July 1927 until paid, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for the costs herein and for whatever other relief, legal or equitable to which they may appear entitled.
