the Chapman Oil company, a corporation engaged in the

sale of gasoline and oils in Mercer County, Kentucky, that Lotta

Rentro the oil inspector for Mercer County, Ky., by herself, agents

and assistants in the inspection of oils and gasoline in Mercer

County, Ky., and especially at the station of the aforesaid company

have continuously permitted samples of gasoline for inspection

to be taken from tanks, casks or barrels, out of their presence

and without their personal knowledge and received such samples

for inspection as if they had in person taken them and they

have continually accepted samples of oil and gasoline furnished

by the owners of gasoline stations or their employees, without

making any test at the time they were furnished or accepted,

and have continually failed to furnish to the owners of said oil

or gasoline any report as to the test, and did not brand and do

not brand the barrels or other receptacles, with a brand contain-

ing the words "Approved Test", but permitted the owners of the oil

and their employees to use the brand approving same.
