The plaintiffs say that they are a firm doing a general Milling business in Cornishville, Kentucky, composed of Robert Horn and Seibert Cooksey; that the defendant Jim Lee Baker is indebted to them in the sum of \$78,00, for flour which the plaintiffs furnished and delivered to the defendant at his special instance and request and for which he agreed to pay; they say that said account is just due and unpaid and that they have demanded payment of same but that the defendant has refused and failed to pay for said flour; they say that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the demand of plaintiffs or of defendants creditors and that the collection of plaintiffs demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiffs pray for a judgment against the defendant Jim Lee Baker for the said sum of \$78,00 with interest, ^{from Jan, 1st 1921} for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant for his costs and whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
