Plaintiff, R. E. Youmans, states that the defendant, Hatton Jones, under date of May 27th 1931 executed and delivered to him his certain promissory note in the amount of \$101.25 due and payable one day after date; that said note was to bear interest at the legal rate or 6% per annum from its date until paid. He says that said note is past due and that payment thereof has been demanded but that the defendant has failed to pay same or any part thereof and that the whole of same is now due and owing and wholly unpaid.

He says that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiff's demand and that the collection of said demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found; that the account is just, due and owing and that plaintiff ought to recover of defendant the sum of \$101.25 with interest until paid and that the nature of the account is as set out in the first paragraph herein.

Wherefore, plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant in the sum of ONE HUNDRED ONE DOLLARS AND TWENTY FIVE CENTS
