The Plaintiff states that on August 14th, 1920 ~~xxxx~~ he purchased of Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co in Cincinnati Ohio a crate of plate glass in different sizes; that on that date said Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co delivered said crate of plate glass in good condition to Cincinnati New Orleans & Texas Pacific Railroad Co at its Cincinnati Ohio freight station, it being a corporation under the laws of Ohio; engaged in the general business of transporting and carrying goods and freight for hire from point to point and maintaining and operating a line of railroad from Cincinnati, Ohio to Burgin, in Mercer County Ky; that on the delivery of said plate glass to the defendant it accepted the same as a common carrier and undertook to transport and deliver the same to the Plaintiff at Harrodsburg, Ky, in Mercer County, for a consideration thereafter to be paid; that it issued a bill of lading evidencing said shipment but that the same is now in the possession of the defendant and the plaintiff is for that reason unable to file the same with this petition, but ~~xxx~~ defendant can file the same; that it was the duty of the defendant to transport and deliver said plate glass in safety and in good condition but it has breached its obligation as a carrier in this that it delivered said plate glass with one piece or size ~~xxxxxxx~~ thereof broken and entirely worthless, to the plaintiff's damage in the sum of \$102.53. no part of which has been paid.

Wherefore the plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant for \$102.53 and interest and costs.
