PETITION IN EQUITY

MILLER B. DEAN,-----DEFENDANT

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Plaintiff, Cogar Grain, Coal & Feed Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the state of Kentucky states that on and between the first and 20th., day of October 1920, it sold and delivered to Defendant at the request of Defendant six bushes of rye at the agreed price of \$2.25 per bushel the particulars of which are stated in the account filed herewith and made a part of this pleading ; that Defendant has not paid any part of said account and that ~~th~~tho requested to do so has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account or any part thereof.

Plaintiff states that this is an action for money due on said account ; that it believes it should have and recover the full amount of said account together with interests and costs ; that the Defendant has not sufficient property in this state to satisfy and pay said indebtedness nor has he sufficient property subject to execution to satisfy and pay the same and the collection thereof will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore Plaintiff prays judgment for \$13.50 with interest from October 25th., 1920 for his costs and for a general order of attachment of Defendant's property or so much thereof as will satisfy said debt interest and costs.
