The plaintiff, Indian Refining Co., states that it is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine and as such it is authorized to contract and be contracted with and to sue and be sued.

The plaintiff states that the defendants, W. H. & W. P. Royalty doing business under the firm name of Royalty Brothers, and as such are indebted to it in the sum of \$85.51 for goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered by this plaintiff to defendants at their special instance and request during the months of October November and December 1921 and the months of January and April 1922 as shown by itemized statement of account filed herewith as a part hereof marked A. Plaintiff states that the total amount of the goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered defendants by it was \$103.11 of which the sum of \$17.60 has been paid, leaving a net balance due of \$85.51 as aforesaid and which sum is now due and owing this plaintiff, and which sum defendants have failed, neglected and refused to pay.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for judgment against defendants for the sum of \$85.51 and for its costs herein and for all proper relief.
