HOW TO ACT IN ELECTRIC STORM

Lightning Takes About 500 Lives Annually; Auto Deaths 36,000 Last Year.

Lightning is far from being one of the major life hazards, but it is a very important property hazard.

Death caused by automobiles in the United States last year were over 36,000, while lightning has rarely been known to take 500 lives a year. Yet nobody fears the automobile, while an electric storm will send many people into a state of great mental anguish.

Lightning damage is done mainly in rural areas, and since it is mainly a property hazard, it follows that danger to life must be greater indoors than out in the open, in spite of all legends to the contrary.

For this reason there are certain simple rules which should be observed at the time a storm is raging.

Electricity is carried by conductors and some of the more important of the telephone and plumbing of all kind. The thing to do is to stay away from these conductors until the storm is over.

The chimney frequently is struck, and the electricity follows the line of least resistance. The charge may jump to an andiron in the fireplace or to a heat pipe, and then to some other conductor not far away.

The plumbing system will at times take the charge of electricity right through into the ground without damage. Or it may emerge from the furnace in the basement.

The outside wires of the telephone may attract the shot and conduct it to the radiator or the lighting fixture.

There is an old rule about staying away from trees during a thunderstorm. This is good advice, as lightning strikes at the highest point below the storm cloud. The highest tree in a group should always be avoided, or an isolated tree.

In an open field the highest point may be a fence post, or a human being may be the highest point. In this case, if the lightning is so close that the thunder and the flash come simultaneously it is better to lie on the ground and wait for the storm to pass rather than to try to run to safety.

If several people throw themselves on the ground it is better to scatter and if there are rocks in the field they should be avoided as rocks are good lightning targets in the open spaces.

Wire fences in the country are another common cause of danger. Every year thousands of cattle are killed on them during a thunderstorm. The fence becomes highly charged with electricity, and it is possible to receive this charge by touching the fence, and even after the storm has passed.

RUG SELECTION TIPS ARE GIVEN

Correct Color Is Most Important Consideration; Complementary And Related Colors

Having the correct color in a room is a most important consideration, as it is a well-known fact that color and color alone is often responsible for the cultivation or development of definite phases of temperament, either good or otherwise.

Inasmuch as the floor covering is the most important color note in the room—it is larger and must be used longer than any other—it must be given more careful thought. These facts of color relations have much to do in the correct selection of rugs and carpets, and if they are taken into consideration it will greatly assist the consumer in making a satisfactory decision.

The fundamentals of color are: There are six primary colors: Red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet. Complementary colors are those which are the direct opposite of another as shown on the color charts in this way—orange is the opposite or complementary color of blue and vice versa—red to green, yellow to violet, etc.

Related colors are those which are definitely influenced by another, such

as yellow-green and green-yellow, both shades related to the primary colors of green or yellow. Complementary colors contrast; related colors blend.

Warm colors are cheerful—they make a room seem smaller.

Warm colors are mostly yellows, oranges, reds, etc.

Cool colors make a room seem larger—they are restful.

Cool colors are mostly greens, blues, violets, etc.

Bright colors stimulate—dull colors are subduing.

Too much of either is bad—they must be balanced.

Light colors are happy, free buoyant.

Dark colors are heavy, depressing.

What has all this to do with rugs and carpets? A very great deal! The most satisfactory carpet or rug is that which emphasizes or is responsible for a combination of these three elements of color in a room: warm or cool, bright or dull, light or dark.

In other words, what is the need of the room in question? Should the rug be selected to act as the foundation color, not for walls decorated with bright wallpaper? Then a plain color carpet or broadloom rug would be most appropriate. In this case, if the wallpaper is quite gay, bright and warmish in color, the room needs a coolish color such as a lovely shade of jade green to bring it into balance.
