Comes now the defendant, James Bunton, and for answer to the plaintiff's petition herein and as a grounds for discharging ~~said~~ the attachment herein and for releasing the garnishee, and says that he is a house keeper with a family consisting of himself, wife and one child; that ~~he~~ has one horse which belongs to him and has one cow which he is keeping for her use and has two mules with which he is making a crop and which belong to Straughter Dean; he, also, has a small guilt and pigs about 4 weeks old- He says that he has no other property of any kind or amount whatever except a little household furniture- he says that the statutes of exemptions allow him \$70.00 for provender for his stock and that said amount will not be sufficient to last the stock he has for one year and that by reason of said statute the money now in the hands of the garnishee in this action is exempt from garnishment- Wherefore he prays for an order dismissing said attachment and discharging said garnishment and that said money in the hands of said garnishee be paid over to him by the garnishee-
