The plaintiff T. A. Huser says that he is engaged in the Grocery business in Harrodsburg, Kentucky, and that the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$21,05, for goods, wares and merchandise which the plaintiff furnished and delivered to the defendant and for which he promised and agreed to pay; he says that said amount is just, due and unpaid and that he believes he should recover said amount with interests and costs from the defendant.

He says that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the claim of the defendant and the demands of defendant's credititors and that the collection of his claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendant for the said sum of \$21,05, with interest, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for his costs and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
