Two landmarks are being removed

from the courthouse yard, one to be replaced with a World War memorial and the other to leave a vacant

spot that will be sodded over. One is the fountain that was given to the county by the Pierian Club in 1912.

Workmen are removing it to the lawn at the Pierian club rooms on North Main street.

The other is the old German cannon that stands on the corner of Main and Court streets.

This was given to the local post of the Legion by the United States government and placed in the court

house yard in 1920. It is now being removed to the American Legion fair grounds on the Bardstown road.
