The plaintiff, Ernest Cannon, says that the defendant, Joe Wilham, is indebted to him in the sum of \$10.00 for services rendered to him by stallion in getting colt; that the statute gives him a lien on the colt begotten by said stallion and that said lien is good for one year and that one year has not expired-

He says that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy plaintiff's demand and the demands of the defendants creditors and that the collection of said demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining a judgment and a return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$10.00 for all the costs expended in this action and for all relief to which he is entitled and for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant and especially against the colt begotten by the service rendered as aforesaid- He prays for all relief-
