Plaintiff, T.A. Huser states that the defendant, Joe Gordon is indebted to him in the sum of \$8.20 on account; that account is just, due and unpaid and the demand has been made for payment defendant has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account or any part of the same.

Plaintiff says that this is an action upon a contract being a contract to pay money on account; that said account is just; that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for judgment against defendant for the sum of \$8.20; for costs of this action and for a general order of attachment of defendant's property including a summons against the garnishee, Burley Tobacco Grower's Cooperative Association and prays further for all other relief to which he may appear to be entitled.
