Hears Broadcast Of Son In Jap Prison

HARRODSBURG, Ky., Jan. 13 (Special)—Mr. and Mrs. Clifton Fowler, of Burgin, four miles east of here received from the War Department the transcript of a broadcast sent out by the Japanese, and intercepted by short wave, from their son, Pfc. Earl Fowler, who was one of Mercer county's 66 men taken prisoners by the Japanese at Bataan April 9, 1942. Fowler is in a Jap prison camp. The broadcast as sent from Washington stated:

"I am doing O. K. Tell everybody hello. Got a letter from Aunt Estell and Uncle Clyde. They said Gar-nett is getting to be a big boy. I'd sure like to see all of you.. Glad to hear Harold is making it well in the Navy. What is Sister Laverne doing now? Is she still at home or working in Ohio. Dad, guess you are getting lots of work to do now. Don't worry about me, I am making it just fine and expect to be home some day. I weigh about 135. God bless you all. With all my love."
