The plaintiffs, John E. Franklin and John L. Sullivan state that they are partners and as such are carrying on and transacting a partnership business under the firm name of Black Diamond Mfg. Co., and were so doing at all times herein mentioned.

Plaintiffs aver that at the special instance and request the sold and delivered to the defendant, W. H. Bunnell, on April 9th. 1920, goods, wares and merchandise for which he promised and agreed to pay the sum of \$62.65 and which goods, wares and merchandise are shown on the account hereto attached marked "A"; and plaintiffs further state that on the 17th. day of May 1920 they sold and delivered to the defendant, at his special instance and request goods, wares and merchandise for which he promised and agreed to pay these plaintiffs the sum of \$27.40, as shown by itemized statement of account hereto attached marked "B".

Plaintiffs aver that said goods, wares and merchandise were reasonably worth the amount charged therefor and which defendant promised and agreed to pay, and that said amounts are now due and owing these plaintiffs and that no part thereof has been paid, although often demanded.

Wherefore plaintiffs pray for judgement against the defendant, W. H. Bunnell, for \$90.05 with interest thereon from May 17th. 1920 and for all proper relief, and for their costs herein.
