

Warrant of Arrest

The Commonwealth of Kentucky,

To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

Josh Payne,

..... has committed the offense of
uttering a check on the Brownsville Deposit Bank of Brown-
ville, Kentucky for \$10.00- to Phillips & Phillips, and no Funds
to pay same with,
in the County of Mercer, the 3rd day of July--1931. 193.....

You are therefore commanded to arrest said *Josh* Payne,

and bring *him* before me to be dealt with according to law.
