Upon a hearing of the application of plaintiff to be permitted to take the insolvent debtor's oath, the proof disclosed the fact to the court that the plaintiff in said application had an undivided 1/8 interest in about 60 acres of land lying and being on the waters of Chaplin River near Dixville, in Mercer County, Ky., and being the place where the defendant and defendant's father now resides and bordering on Dry Fork and lying on Eastside of the Old Dixville pike and bordering on said pike and adjoining Aunt Almedia Lewis.

The plaintiff it is adjudged also owns a 1/8th interest in all the crops of both corn and hay grown on said lands this year. This is the judgment of the Court notwithstanding the plaintiff claims that he has sold the land to his father, but defendant is a minor and has not capacity to sell his property and besides said alleged sale was made to his father just 4 or 5 days before his arrest under the bastardy warrant and about two weeks after the child was born and the defendant plaintiff received no consideration in money or property at said time. It is further adjudged that the all the right to, title in and possession of said property vested in the sheriff of Mercer County, Ky., S.W. Kennedy, and that he has full custody and control of said property in trust for the use and benefit of the said bastard child as aforesaid and the said property and its proceeds to be paid and delivered to the mother of said child, Martha Patterson.
