The Plaintiff, Mercer County Fair Association, states that it is a corporation, organized under the laws of Kentucky, and thereby authorized to contract and be contracted with, to sue and be sued, in its corporate name.

It states that the Defendants, James Currens and John M. Merryman, on January 12, 1923, by their promissory note, which they executed and delivered to Plaintiff, promised and agreed to pay it on October 1, 1923, the sum of SIXTY TWO & 50/100 Dollars (\$62.50) with interest thereon from Oct. 1, 1923, at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from said date until paid. Plaintiff says that no part of said note has been paid, and the same is long past due. The note is filed herewith as part hereof, marked "A".

Wherefore Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendants for the sum of \$62.50 and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per centum per annum from Oct. 1, 1923 until paid and its cost herein expended. It prays for all proper relief.
