I am manager of the Collection Department of the Iroquois Manufacturing Company.

#2. Yes. The date of the sale was July 15, 1914.

#3. We represented that our material would waterproof a Roof, if applied in accordance with our specifications.

#4. We have been in business about eight years.

#5. Different methods are followed for covering roofs of different types. I am attaching hereto, marked "Exhibit A", a copy of the Specification folder we issue to govern the proper application of Adamite.

#6. We receive no complaints from our trade on account of unsatisfactory results, when the material is applied to conform with our specifications. If Adamite is put on a roof in too thin a layer, or if the covering is not continuous to protect every portion of the surface, leakage is liable to occur through
