1. The Plaintiff states that the defendant John Dunn is indebted to them in the sum of \$131.43 for goods wares, merchandise, including labor, materials and repairs for an automobile Overland car six cylinder five passenger car which said material, labor, supplies were furnished to John Dunn at his special instance and request between June 20, 1918 and July 20, 1918, and an itemized statement thereof will be filed if required; that said sum is just, and unpaid.

They state that on Nov. 7, 1918, they filed with the Mercer County Court, the County of the residence of said Dunn and the County in which said labor material and supplies were furnished their affidavit showing the amount due for same with a description of said car and thereby asserted a mechanic's and material men's lien on said car for the said sum of \$131.43 and \$1.25 filing and releasing fees; that said affidavit was duly filed and accompanied by an itemized statement of the amount due and was duly indexed in said office and made of record therein; a copy of same is filed herewith; that said car is now being used by, and in the possession of the defendant James Parsons.

Wherefore they pray judgment against Dunn for \$131.43 with 6% interest from July 20, 1918 and \$1.25 and costs, and that it be adjudged a lien on said machine; that the lien be enforced by sale of the car and generally for costs and all proper relief.
