George P. Bent Company, Plaintiff.

vs. Judgment

Agnes Churchill, Defendant.

The Defendant, Agnes Churchill, having been duly summoned herein and failing to answer, it is adjudged by the court that Plaintiff, George P. Bent Company, recover of said Defendant the sum of Seventy-four Dollars and Seventy-five Cents (\$74.75) and interest thereon from February 10, 1917, ~~xxxxxxx~~, at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, until paid and <sup>its</sup> ~~xxx~~ cost herein expended.

The court further adjudges that to secure said debt, interest and cost, the Plaintiff has a valid and subsisting lien on one Concord Piano, style G, No. 28516, which is in the possession of Defendant, and is entitled to an enforcement thereof by sale of said instrument. C. T. Corn----- is hereby appointed special commissioner to execute this judgment. He is directed to make said sale at the ~~courthouse door,~~ storehouse of The Music Supply Co., on the South side of Poplar Street, in Harrodsburg, Ky., at public outcry, to the highest and best bidder, on a credit of three months, on some day to be fixed by himself, taking bond for the purchase price, payable to himself, with good surety thereon, and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from date of sale until paid.

Before making said sale he will advertise the time, terms and place of sale, together with a description of the property to be sold and the sum for which it is to be made, by written or ~~printed~~ printed notices up; one at the courthouse door in Harrodsburg, Ky. ~~at the~~ and three others at public places in the city of Harrodsburg, Ky., for at least Ten (10) days immediately preceding the day of sale. For the purposes of sale a writ of possession is hereby awarded Plaintiff for said piano, which shall issue ~~to the sheriff of Mercer, or any other county, on~~ at the request of ~~Plaintiff~~ or Plaintiff.

He will report his action herein immediately after the sale.
