

Kentucky Overseas War Dead Returned for Burial In U. S.

Sixteen Kentuckians are among the 925 World War II dead who have been returned from the Pacific area aboard the Army transport Pvt. Joseph F. Merrill for final burial in the United States.

The dead originally were buried in U. S. military cemeteries in New Guinea, the Philippine Islands, and Japan.
