To the Sheriff, Constable, Jailer, Marshal, or Policeman in the State of Kentucky:

It appearing that there are reasonable grounds for believing that

You are therefore commanded to arrest said ~~Arthur Johnson~~

and bring him before me to be dealt with according to law.
