

Second Son Jap Prisoner . . .

Private James W. Sallee, Son Of Mrs. Sarah Sallee, Danville, Was Member Of Harrodsburg Guards

Private James William Sallee, son of Mrs. Sarah Sallee of 318 Alta avenue, is a prisoner of war of the Japanese, it was learned by his mother Saturday when she received a telegram from the War Department.

This is the second time Mrs. Sallee has had to face the fact that a son was a war prisoner. Early in April she learned that Sergeant Heze Franklin Sallee was a prisoner of the Japanese in the Philippine Islands.

Private Sallee had not previously been heard from since December 21, 1941.

With his brother, Sergeant Sallee, he was a member of the Harrodsburg National Guard, and left for the Philippines in October, 1940.

Another son in service is Chief Petty Officer John D. Sallee, stationed at Norfolk, Virginia.

Mrs. Sallee has been a widow since her youngest child was a little over two months old.

A son, David, is an employe of a local garage, and another son, George, is a farmer in this county.

Her only daughter is Mrs. Cora Bugg of Adams street, Danville.
