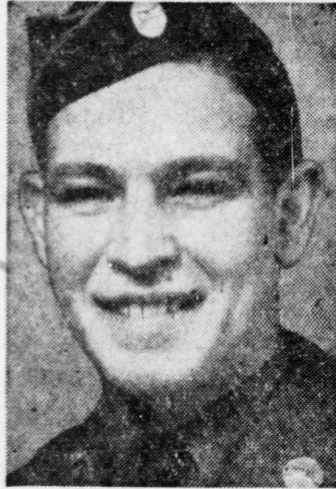
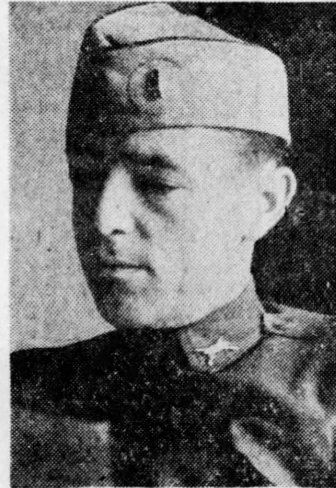


Another Louisvillian In Philippine Prison

Among the Kentuckians held prisoner by Japs.

Word that her son-in-law, Lieut. Marion L. Danan, is being held as prisoner of war by the Japanese in the Philippines was received yesterday by Mrs. Evert Thomas, 1621 Edgeland, from the War Department. Her husband, Maj. Evert Thomas, previously had been reported a prisoner.

Mrs. Thomas and her daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Danan, who lives with her mother and is employed at Fort Knox, last heard from their husbands in February, 1942. Mrs. Thomas returned to Louisville six months before the war broke out.

Her son, Sergt. George N. Thomas, 19, joined the Army at Fort McKinley, Philippines, in order to stay with his father. She now has hopes that her son,

reported missing since early in 1942, is alive.

Six other Kentuckians were listed as prisoners of the Japanese in the Philippines area. They are Capt. Lee Gardner Miles, son of Arey N. Miles, Eminence; Capt. Thomas W. Spickard, Lexington; First Lieut. George A. Van Arsdall; Capt. Edwin W. Rue, First Lieut. William Gentry and Sergt. John E. Sadler, all of Harrodsburg.
