Cards Received From  
Jap-Held Mercer Men

HARRODSBURG, Ky., Aug. 13  
(Special)—Several cards from Har-  
rodsburg's former National Guards-  
men, held prisoners of war by  
the Japanese government, have  
reached families here. These are  
the first messages to be received  
since the Japanese captured the  
Philippines. No dates are given  
and the communications are form  
cards signed by the senders.

The first to arrive was a card  
from Capt. Edwin (Skip) Rue,  
commanding officer of Company D,  
192nd Tank Battalion. Others who  
have received cards are Mrs. Field  
McLeod Reed, from her husband  
who said he was in Japanese Mili-  
tary Camp No. 10 in the Philip-  
pines; Mrs. Garnett Royalty, from  
her husband; Mr. and Mrs. Wiley  
Chumley, from their son, Pvt.  
George Everett Chumley, saying  
he also was in Military Camp No.  
10 in the Philippines and ending  
his communication "Merry Christ-  
mas and Happy New Year." Mrs.  
I. W. Rue had a card from her  
son, Lt. Arch Rue, stating he was  
in Prison Camp No. 1.
